Purpose: To establish a policy which benefits graduating community youth directly from the Clinton and District Community Forest Ltd.

Recommendations for Scholarships/Bursaries:

- 1. Successful applicants will be graduates from David Stoddard School
- 2. Up to \$4000.00 will be awarded to successful applicants at the discretion of the Board
- 3. The procedure to apply is:
 - a) open to any graduate, who is a permanent resident of Canada;
 - b) submission of latest report card;
 - c) acceptance to a post-secondary institution;
 - enrolment must be confirmed before award funds are granted;
 - e) an essay of at least 250 words on the advantage of having a community forest in the Clinton area is required;
 - f) applications must be received by June 1;
 - g) applicants to be interviewed by 2 Directors;

- i) the successful applicant must be enrolled in a post-secondary institution within 2 academic years of the awarding of the scholarship/bursary
